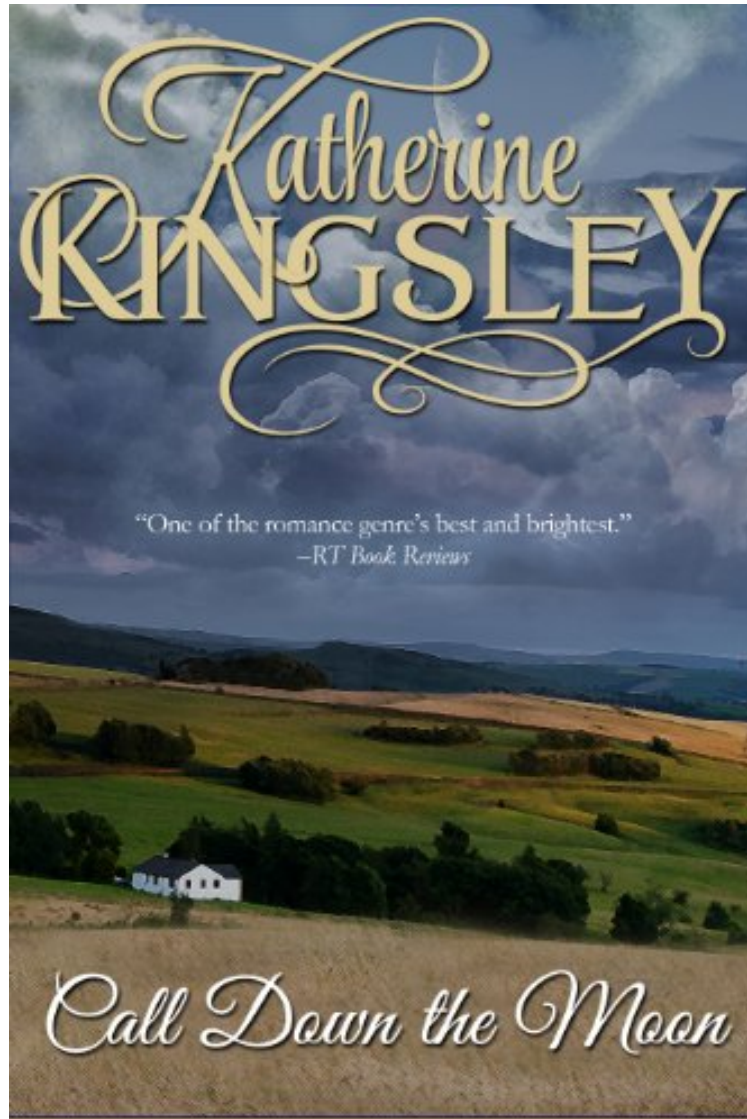

She creates an appealing heroine, humorous situations and charmingly eccentric characters like the "aunties." Unfortunately, the hero is smug, selfish, and arrogant for most of the story. Kingsley tries to provide a traumatic past to explain the hero's shortcomings but as he is unaware of it, it didn't engender any sympathy for his constant lying. Hugo finally does begin to mature and grow, but then the story abruptly ends! Hugo doesn't really suffer any consequences for his selfish behavior and no one, not even Meggie, ever sees the depths of his deceptions.
