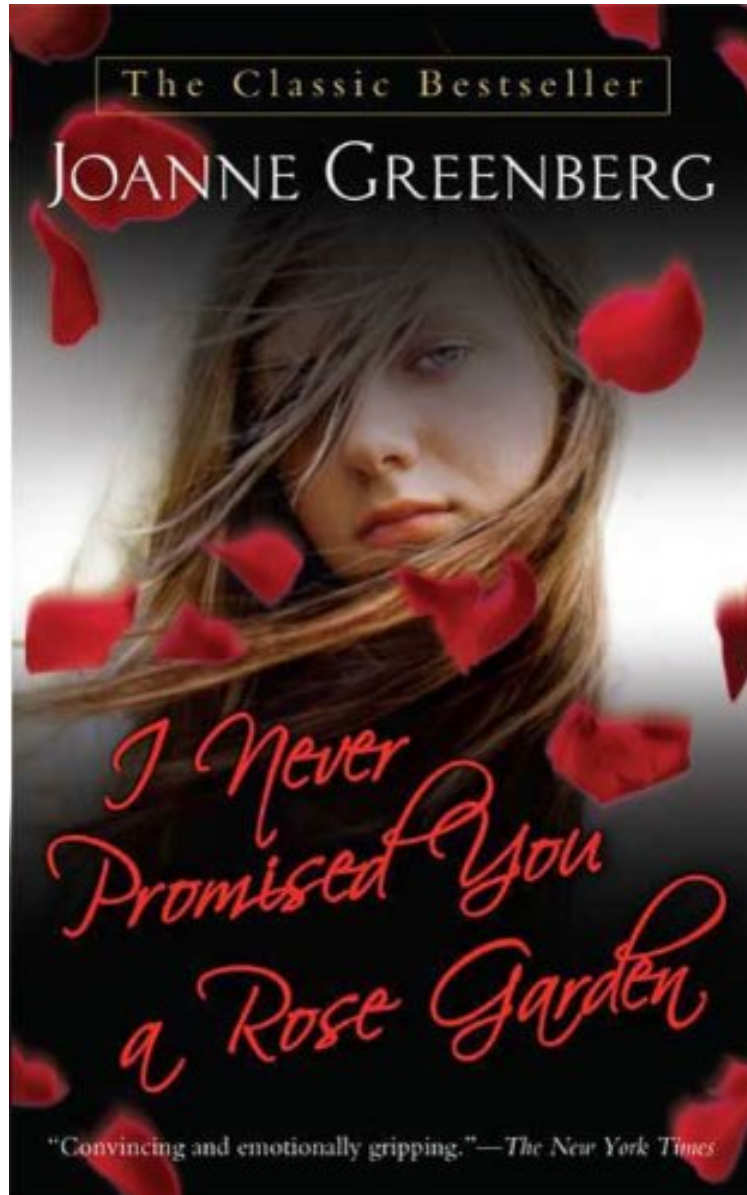

Joanne Greenberg guides us step-by-step through Deborah's world, introduces us to a new level of feeling and shows, how the 'outside world' tries to 'heel' Deborah. I choose this book, because I enjoyed 'One Flew Over the Cuckoo's nest' so much. And I wasn't disappointed. The rich and flowing language really draws you into this book and lets you see, how Dr. Fried tries to convince Deborah to stay in the reality. Dr. Fried herself has encountered gruesome things in Germany, in times of the Second Worldwar. How should you explain somebody, who has a complete world for his or her own, that this world really is worth living in? How does this 'real' life look for somebody, that is assumed to be sick, by the people who know? Slowly, Dr. Fried manages to gain Deborah's trust and long sessions of talking and refusing, accepting and exploring take place. The intelligent dialogues and moral conflicts (Is the choice of reality a choice of freedom? Who is the mad one? What is 'normal'?) lead the reader into a very interesting perspective and leave him yet enough space to find his own conclusions - beautiful to read, a book for heart, head and soul. Dr. Fried, eine ehemals deutsche Psychologin, versucht, Deborah durch Gesprche zurckzugewinnen. Dr. Fried hat den 2. Weltkrieg miterlebt und bekommt seit dem selbst oft Zweifel ob der Definition von Wahnsinn'. Wie sollte man jemanden berzeugen, dass diese Welt ein Leben wert ist? Wie sieht das reale Leben fr jemanden aus, der von anderen Leuten als krank' angesehen wird? Langsam gewinnt Dr. Fried Deborah's Vertrauen. I recently saw it at the library and decided to take it out and read it again. I just finished re-reading it and found it as powerful as I remembered, possibly even more so. "I Never Promised You a Rose Garden" presents a complete picture of mental illness from the patient's point of view, without the stigma of wrongness that is frequently associated with it. The picture painted is a very real one, from Deborah's relief when the doctors confirm what she's known all along, that something is not right, to the way her family deals with the fact of her illness. Greenberg/Green evokes very strong emotions with her writing. You feel Deborah's fear that her secret world of Yr will punish her for revealing its existence to her doctor, and you share in her triumph when she begins to make her way back to the world. I put down this book with a little more understanding of how it must feel to be mentally ill. I would recommend it to anyone, teen or adult.
