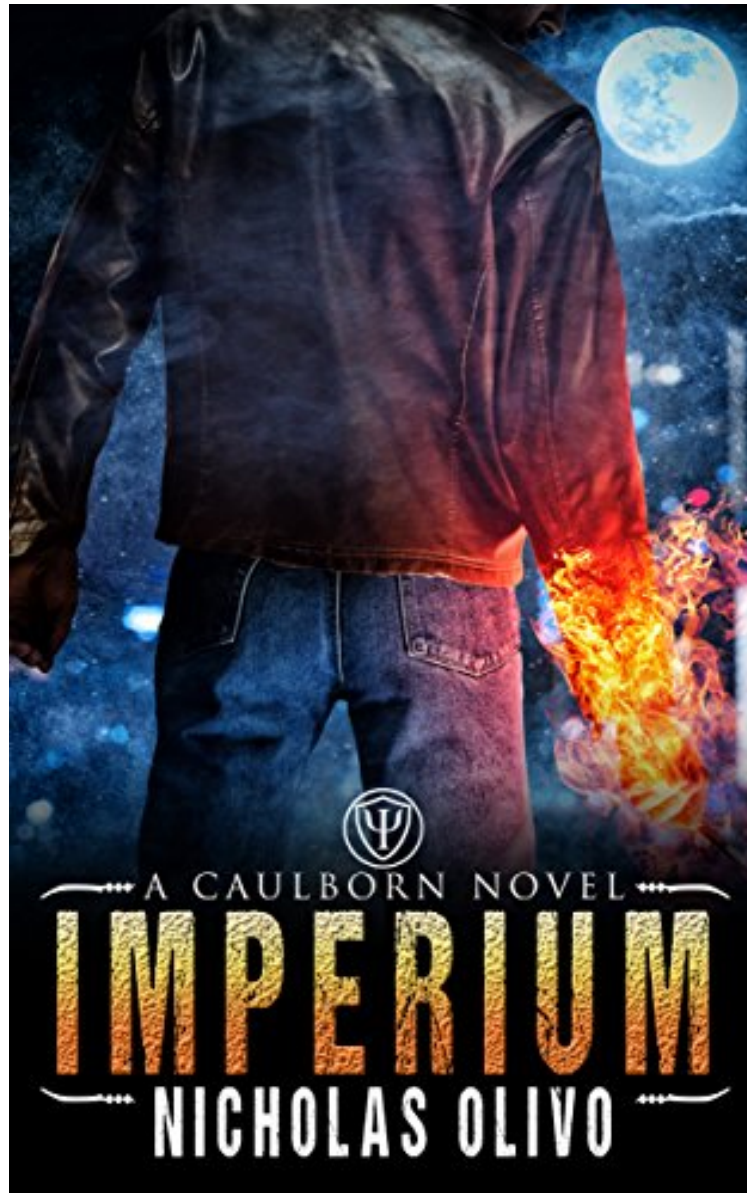

cop drama, though with a lot of extra trappings and flair. The main character is a God in another dimension and works for the local "supernatural police" with all of the MIB tropes of "the populace can't handle the knowledge, so we have to keep things unseen." His partner is missing and so are others in the supernatural world. He ends up with a new (female) partner and the mandate from his legendary boss to figure it all out. The story then unfolds along with the investigation. There are a number of misdirects and twists that make it interesting along the way. One of these is the existence of Vincent's "following". He is a God to a bunch of Fae on the "brightside" which funnel their powers to him in the form of faith. It reminds me a lot of an old DnD cleric, who has to pray every morning for their God to grant them powers. Here we have a reversal, where the God has to grant prayers every morning to restore his "faith reserves," which he then taps quite heavily during the story. It is indeed an interesting twist, though I expect it could get tiring through a long series. He is a protector and carekeeper rather than controller of their lives. The crime investigation develops well. There are enough complexities to make it not a forgone conclusion, though enough hints that I wasn't overly surprised either. There are a lot of different mythologies mixed up here with cameos of the Four Horsemen. Overall it is a fun read, not a brain-burner.
