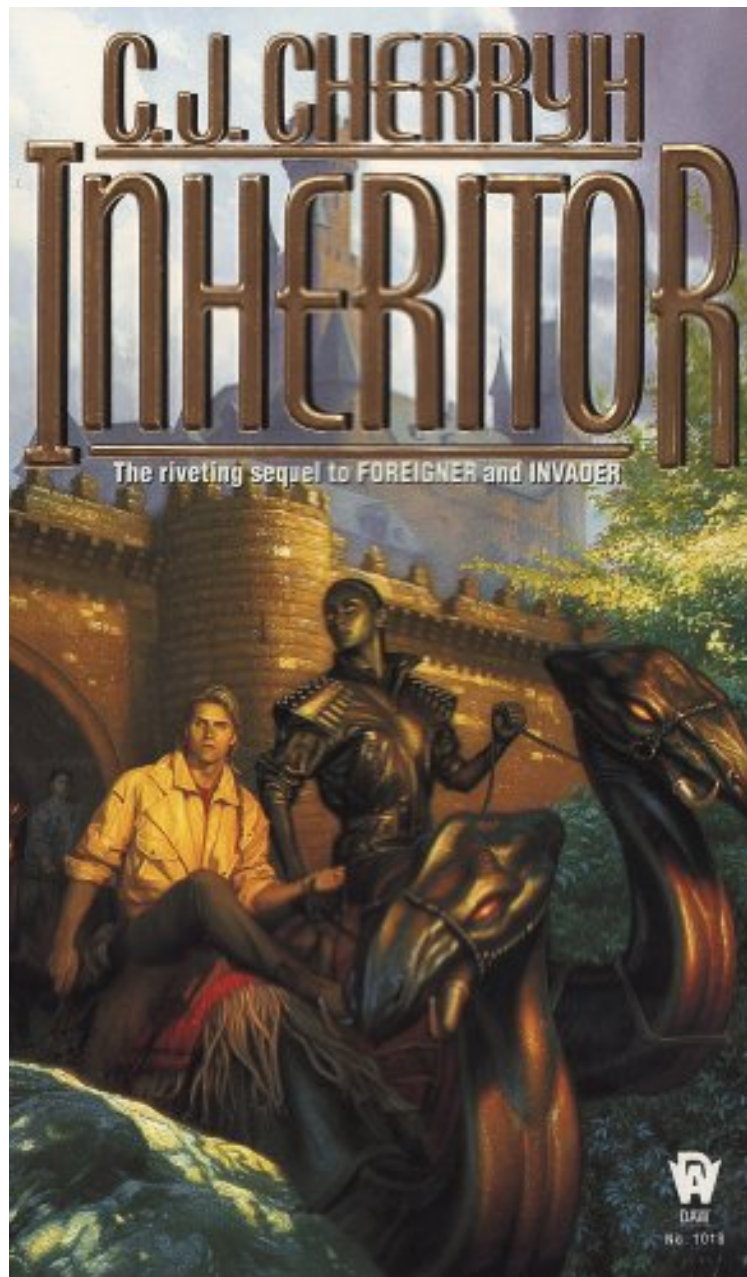

 Like the first two novels the story centres upon the one human ambassador in alien territory. As a novel Cherryth concentrates all of her attention on one principal character, Bren, in such a way that we see the world and the events which affect him through his eyes only. Nothing happens if Bren does not see it. As the majority of all other characters are the alien atevi, all your attention is focused on Bren in a claustrophobic manner, which after a while pulls you into the story and wholly on Bren's side. You may find this tiring, as the focus never shifts from Bren. As always with Cherryth's characters and alien world's, events, people and places are described in detail and are completely believable, particularly the alien society and culture. After three novels (apparently three more are planned) and I must confess that the plot and the drama have not moved on very much, the things picked up remarkably at the end of inheritor. Those familiar with Cherryth's work will appreciate the details and intensity of the character study and the complete focus on one character only. Those not so familiar, may not enjoy narrow range of possibilities which this represents. On the whole a very which and enjoyable series, which explores the tensions and difficulties which human first contact with an alien culture might experience. If you haven't read Cherryth' s. work before then I would recommend starting with the classic science fiction novel 'Downbelow Station'.

 Dolmetscher Bren hat nun endlich menschliche Gesellschaft, denn das "Schiff" hat den jungen Lehrer Jase in die Atevi Hauptstadt als Phaidi geschickt. Leider luft es mit Jase nicht so einfach wie Bren gehofft hat und auch in seiner Heimat Mospheira geht offenbar alles schief. Denn er ist von seiner dortigen Familie fast komplett abgeschnitten worden und als Verrter in Verruf geraten. Und wieder ist es die Konkurrentin Deana Hanks, die die Fden zieht und Unruhe auf dem Kontinent und unter den Atevi stiftet. Vielleicht kann die taffe Atevi-Oma Ilisidi eine grere Katastrophe noch verhindern, oder plant sie etwa schon wieder ihre eine Intrige gegen ihren Enkel und seinen Phaidi?

Man darf sich als Leser wirklich auf spannende Wendungen und etliche groe berraschungen, nicht nur hinsichtlich der Atevi Natur, gefasst machen.  Inheritor ist der 3. Teil der Foreigner-Reihe. Man sollte also Foreigner und Invader gelesen haben, bevor man dieses Buch liest. Jase, der Botschafter des Raumschiffs bei den Atevi, befindet sich inzwischen eine Weile auf dem Planeten. Er spricht schon relativ gut Ragi, darf sich aber noch nicht alleine in der ffentlichkeit aufhalten. So kommt es zu einem schweren Konflikt zwischen Jase und Bren: Whrend Bren im Land unterwegs ist, erhlt Jase die Nachricht, dass sein Vater gestorben sei. Er hat aber keine Mglichkeit Bren oder seine Familie auf dem Schiff zu kontaktieren. Nach Brens Rckkehr flippt Jase ziemlich aus und die politische Situation auf dem Festland ist nach einem erfolgreichen Attentat in Bewegung. Jase und Bren geraten mitten unter die agierenden Atevi-Krft...Das Buch ist genauso spannend wie schon die ersten beiden Bnde, und man mchte auch bei diesem wissen, wie es weitergeht, wenn es zuende ist.
