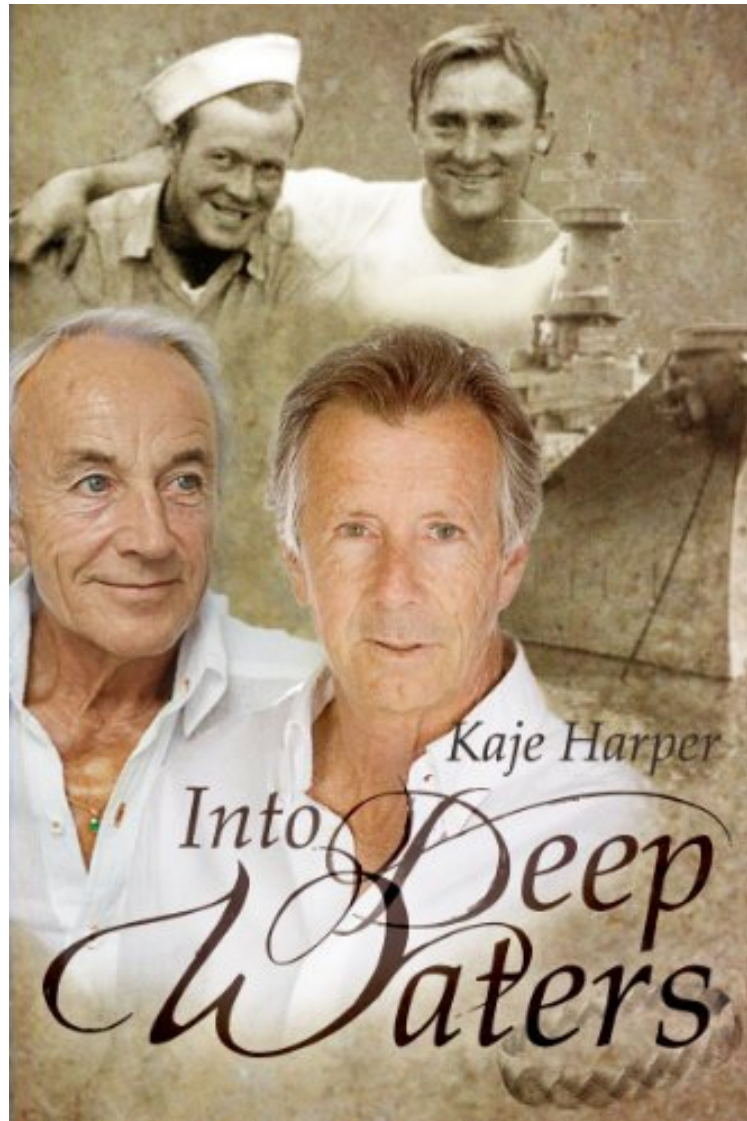

Von Silvia After reading and enjoying The Rebuilding Year, I started to look for other words from this very talented author and I was thrilled to be able to snatch up this freebie. The story of Jacob (Trip) and Daniel starts in WWII, and it spans an entire lifetime. It's only logical that not all stages of their life together can be touched in such detail as their early years, or this would have become an epic of Tolkienesque dimensions. While I would have liked to have read some more of their lives in the 50s (if only to be able to better picture them in Rockabilly wear!), and especially in the 80s when AIDS started tumbling everything upside down, I'm not complaining. Most m/m romances, well, most romances per se touch a few years at best, long enough for the couple to meet, fall in love, maybe start a family etc. It's rare to be given a book that shows what happens after the classical HEA is it really HAPPY ever after once the fluffy happy clouds wear off? Fortunately, in this case, it is. Yes, Trip and Daniel have to suffer through some rough patches with Trip slipping back into his promising career and Daniel fighting what is now known as PTSD, and yes, there are family issues to be taken into consideration. I'm glad, however, that the author chose not to add more drama by forcing either man to marry a nice girl for appearances sake although I'm sure that happened more often than not in real life. It's a very lovely read, well written, the sexy scenes are sexy but not vulgar, life on board a WWII ship comes across frighteningly detailed but not too claustrophobic, there's talk about Japs and queers that gives an authentic flavour but will not make a modern day reader cringe. Taking into consideration this was written for some sort of contest, it's an amazing piece of work, and I recommend it to anyone who's interested in reading an m/m story that's set against a historical background that is not Regency, and that's contemporary enough for modern day readers to connect with it.
