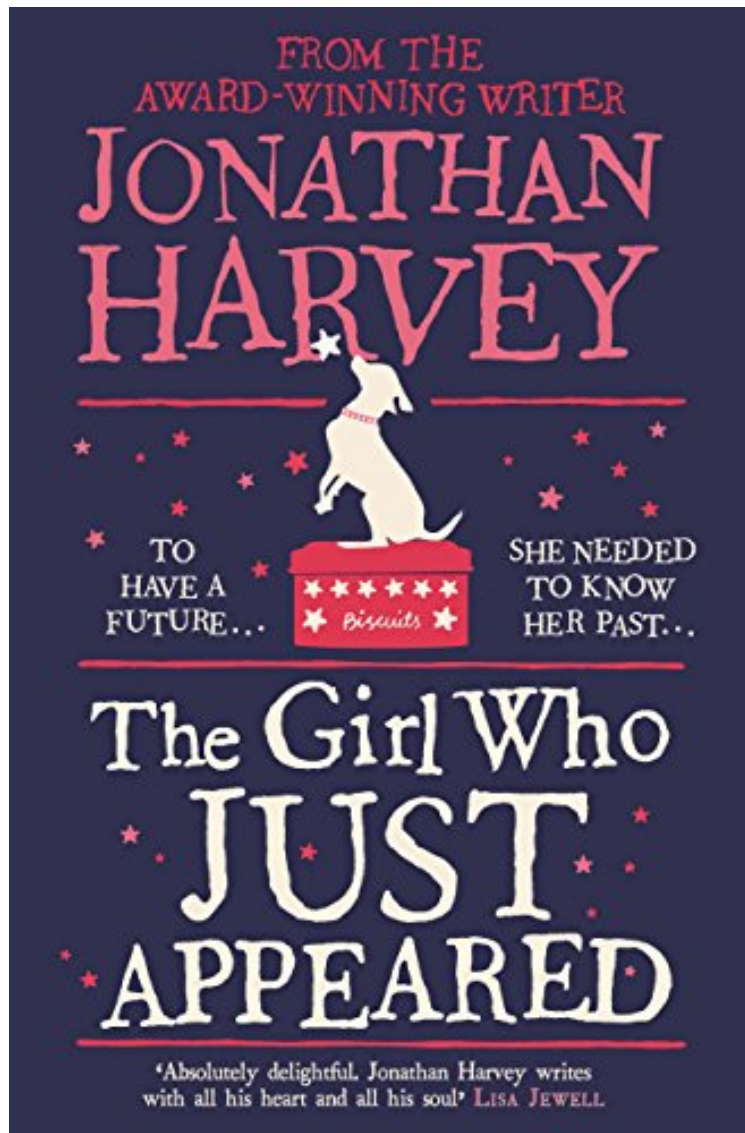

While that may be the case, the long build-up makes the whole read enjoyable in the end. The narration definitely kept me guessing and even after everything was pretty clear, there were some very entertaining twists and turns.Not a super-intellectual read (and does it always have to be?) - but

still deals with important topics and very, very entertaining. Nothing special about language, voice, composition etc, but more than decent throughout and absolutely kept me wanting to know what was going to happen, so very enjoyable read. No complaints, really Von Jacky from Germany This book seemed a bit unsure of what it was supposed to be, with a humorous chick-lit style beginning (was surprised to see it was written by a man!) and then moving into a completely different genre. But this was clearly divided into different sections, with the use of different typefaces, italics, etc., to differentiate between the voices. A good story, unusual, and leads you gently into the strange revelation - some will get it sooner, some later. It was an easy read, although, a couple of times, I got the impression he was sitting with a map of Liverpool in front of him, awkwardly trying to shoe-horn street names and Liverpoolian landmarks into the narrative. But, apart from that, well done, Jonathan Harvey - I'll be happy to read anything else you have written.
