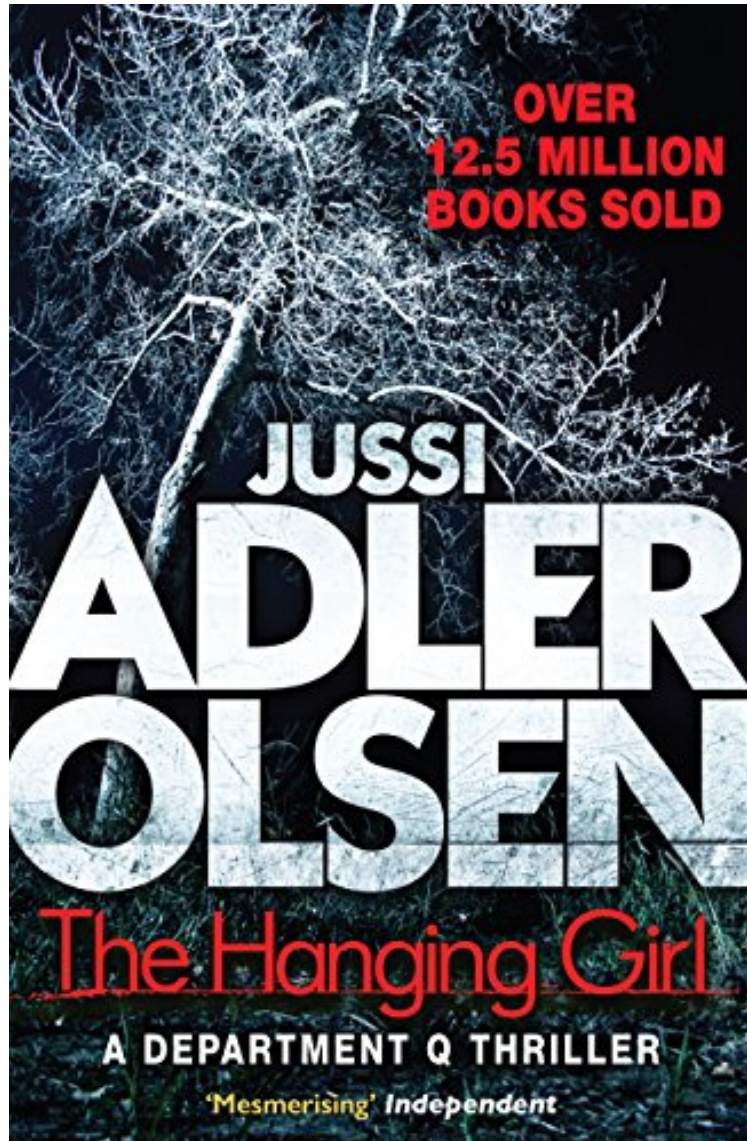

much. A case of a hit-and-run accident 20 years ago on the island of Bornholm, a suicide policeman totally absorbed by resolving the mystery and leaving Carl Colleagues to finish his work. Not the smartest start for a gripping crime-novel. Too many papers, too many people, too many places, it was too much of everything. Then the per se interesting sun-cult and pages and pages of explaining early religions starting in caverns, passing by Hammurabbi and Horus - I always thought was Ra, the sun-god for the Egyptians, that made the trip over heaven in his golden barge every day. And Horus was the son of Isis and Osiris... But all this has then amably been transformed into actually existing religions - and cults like the one Atu founded. Too many details to be found mostly by case, too many people who are misleading our team of investigators. And so many parallel story lines to be told, like Pirjo the perfect psycho-/sociopath killing out of love and jealousy, and getting away with it for years. Not a slip in her behaviour, not one shadow of a suspect on her, she commands everything - all the others, Atu included, are merely bystanders. A bit incredible...No - I did not like the half of it. Carl, Rose and Assad hypnotized right out of their personal problems, a heroic saving of life in the last minute, very fitting deaths now and then, until the very end. But then the old case with the nail-gun too - when Hardy remained paralyzed for 7 years now and Carl was deeply maimed inside his soul - after all these long, long years good news from Netherlands! Who is buying THAT coincidence, I ask You? Oh - both, Police and Press, obviously! A pure cliff-hanger in my eyes. And then a very accommodating end - by all means, everything wrapped up nicely in the last pages. And ready to be buried again - this time forever, I hope...OK - a good read for real fans of the Department Q, but I really want more for my money. Carl, Rose, Assad and now Gordon are known to the faithful readers as real bloodhounds - never leave a picked-up trail alone. But this time there was much less coordinated cooperation, the odd "Oh, I simply forgot". Or seasoned investigators being overthrown the way they were - no, that is not the right path to follow. I can only hope that Mr Jussi Adler-Olsen will think a bit more and longer about the next thriller with our team. Who I personally would like to see - in their private life, too - a bit more stable and yes, a bit happier. All of them.
