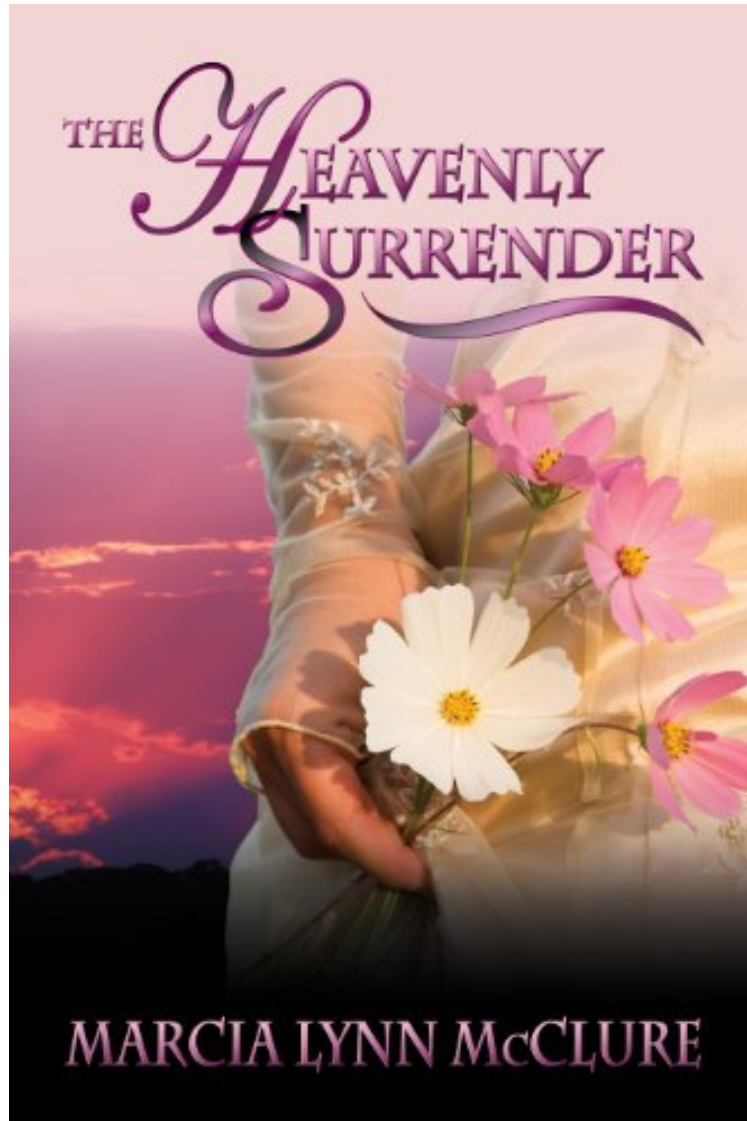

Genieva and Brevan are made for each other and the events that bring them closer together also draw the reader into their personal stories and characters.Genieva does not meet Brevan's expectation when he picks her up at the station - instead of a sturdy woman to help with his farm, he finds a `cute' girl and his instant response is to send her back. Genieva immediately demonstrates that she is

no push-over by challenging him with his broken word. The slow development of their deep love for each other is hindered by misunderstandings, but the love when expressed is based on trust and respect and all the more special for that. There is danger all around with one person in particular continually lurking with evil intent. Brevan and his family have to fight for everything precious to them. Brevan is very driven but he has that special twinkle in his eye. As fragile as Genieva initially appears, she proves to be courageous and strong. Von AHAI already stopped reading after 20% of the book. The main characters are more often than not simply embarrassing. The main female character (Genieva) is naive in way that is almost painful. She thinks her husband is very "determined" because he has decided to plow the fields in spring within the next days after her arrival. Well, he is a farmer. What else shall he do? The dialogues are very artificial. While speaking the characters always address each other with first names and the siblings keep calling each other constantly "brother" or "sister" - in every single paragraph. The Mexican sister-in-law can't hardly speak more than two sentences without mixing some useless Spanish words into a conversation: "Mi amiga! Genieva! You have come to keep me company, no?" Finally, the author has a lasting tendency to overemphasize: In one paragraph the reader is informed that Genieva has worked very hard for two days and her body aches and is sore. In the next paragraph after a short dialogue the author continues: "Genieva was so exhausted!". Well, who would have guessed?
