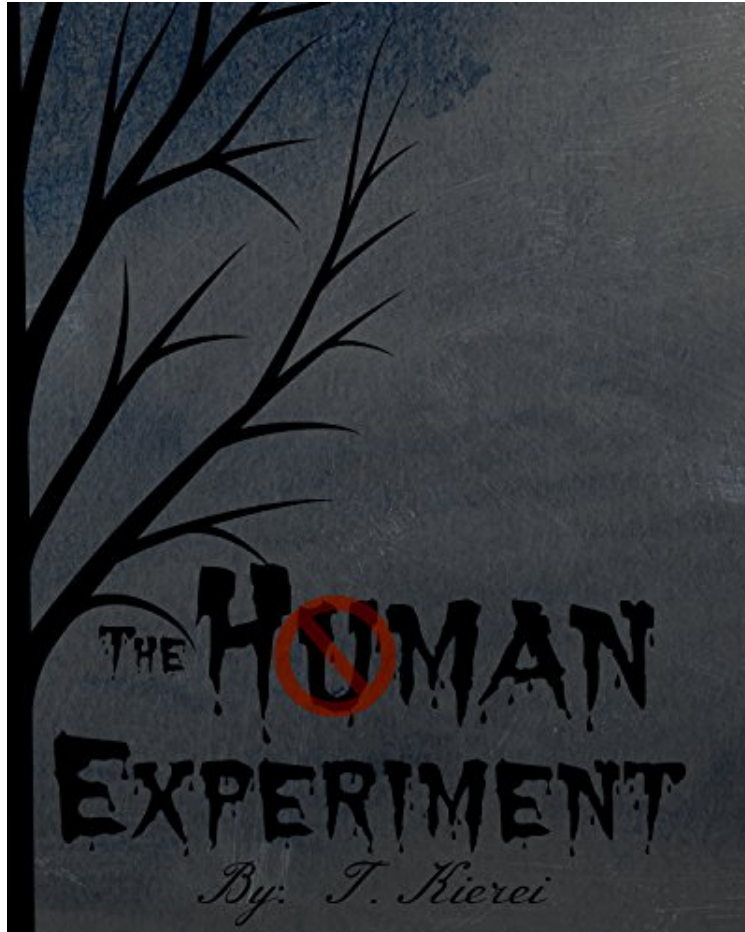

The style is really good and there are nearly any typos (which can't be praised enough, though I erroneously thought so for a long time - until reality taught me better).The story is about a nearly 17 year old boy - Rolland. He is deaf and lives in an orphanage. Of course, he is mobbed by cruel kids, has no friends and is really lonely - and dreaming of having someday parents and siblings, being part of a loving family.Being adopted by a nice couple is his dream come true - until he meets Dart and Bryce, twins and his new brothers. What he doesn't know is the real reason for his adoption. To tame the bloodlust of their sons and to teach them respect towards humans (they aren't just the next meal), their parents adopted Rolland for the young vampire twins as their human pet. Their mother hopes that this interracial experiment could teach them how to better behave in the human world.There are some twists, I don't expected and I would say that the experiment failed,

though in the end the twins had learned a lot. But they don't change their minds: they still think that humans are weak, strange, need babysitting, are fragile and pets, not equals, but nice pets to have around, not only for feeding. So the reader shouldn't expect an interracial romance between equals. The POV changes between Rolland and the twins, but most is written in Rolland's POV. That only emphasize how different humans and vampires are and that the twins constantly manipulate Rolland while treating him like a child. Even in the end, they are lying to him without remorse (well, he is only a pet). It is really funny that Rolland gets his dog and now has a pet for himself. There are quite some similarities how Rolland treats his pet and the twins treat their human pet. There are some flaws though: - after 17 years in the orphanage the completely deaf Rolland not only can speak but pronounces perfectly clear and understandable - that's quite a miracle if you ever heard a deaf talking - how comes that Rolland never learned to read lips? If his talking is so perfect he should be easily able to do that. - nearly everyone just happens to know sign language - there is nearly no bureaucracy in the process of adopting Rolland - must be a nice world! - Rolland's flu with coughing, sniffing and high fever magically disappears in a dramatic scene, although he spends half a night in the cold basement without proper clothes or a blanket - 17 year old Rolland often acts like a child of 13 or 14 years (the twins starts at age 18, but were such brats, which isn't impossible for their age, so that's ok) - most adults act strange and not at all adult-like (doc, teachers, Mrs. S. from the orphanage etc.), so it just seems as if the author is really young (that would explain some flaws in the adult world like the missing bureaucracy, the strange acting later foster parents, the art teacher etc.) - after his "accident" Rolland quasi stops signing totally and just talks to everyone aloud and only "reads" the answering signs. Why? He notices early in hospital that he knows sign language. Well, most of that are minor flaws and can be ignored. So if you don't expect some romance with sudden revelations on the vampire part, love that conquers all racial differences or worldly vampires, but enjoy a teenie story with developing characters (it is nice that Rolland has at least some self-esteem after his "accident") and a really suitable end (no HEA at all), you should try this book. It is a nice read and after throttling the twins for their opinions of humans and accepting them as they are, it is even enjoyable.
