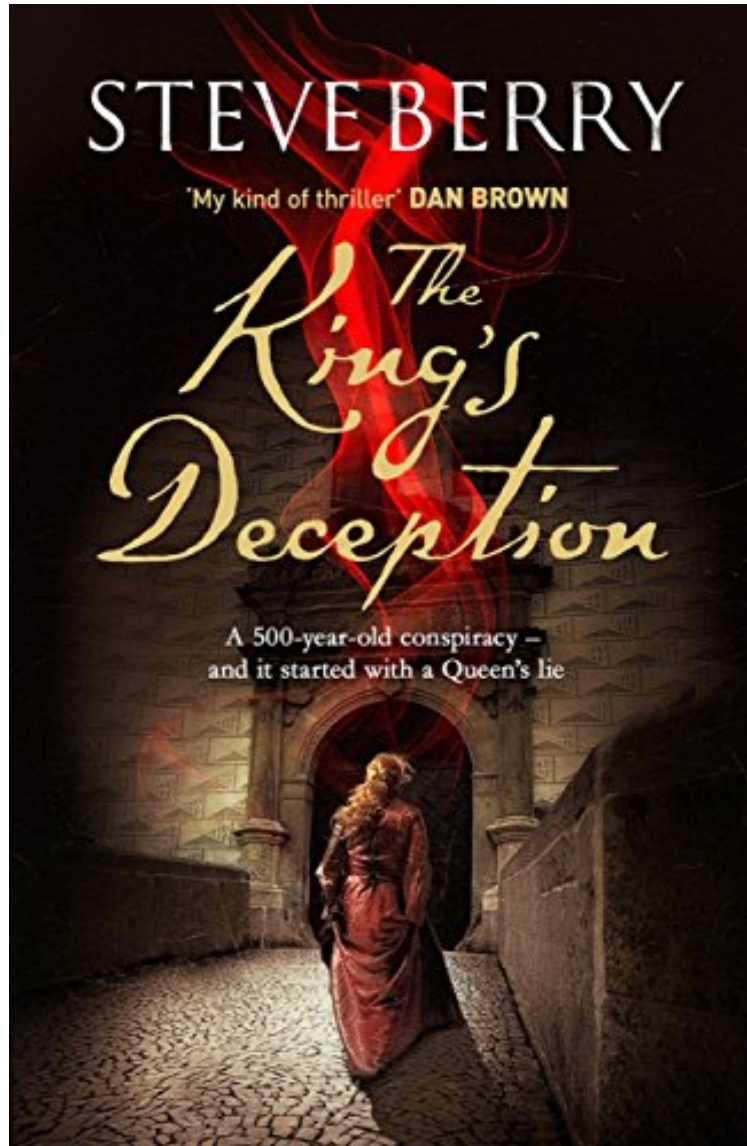

Steve might be back in action! But well...although it isn't as bad as the Columbus book, it was still a tiresome and sometimes boring slog to get through. The history was solid, but to be quite frank (and without giving away any plot points), the plot was quite ridiculous. When you finally get to the crux of the book, and you realise the direction Berry is taking it, you will be thinking "WTF? Has Berry gone off his meds or what?". Some of the characters are also quite boring, such as Ian the street kid, who you just want to fall off a bridge somewhere and never come back. The CIA agent is also rather obnoxious, but thankfully Malone's son, Gary, manages to stay quiet and not become too much of an annoying character. He does his part without managing to piss everyone off in the process. It took a lot of willpower to get to the end of this book, and I don't like fighting the urge to stop reading and throw the book in the corner. So Steve had better improve quickly with his next book - The Lincoln Myth - due out next year - otherwise I am going to stop reading his stuff.
