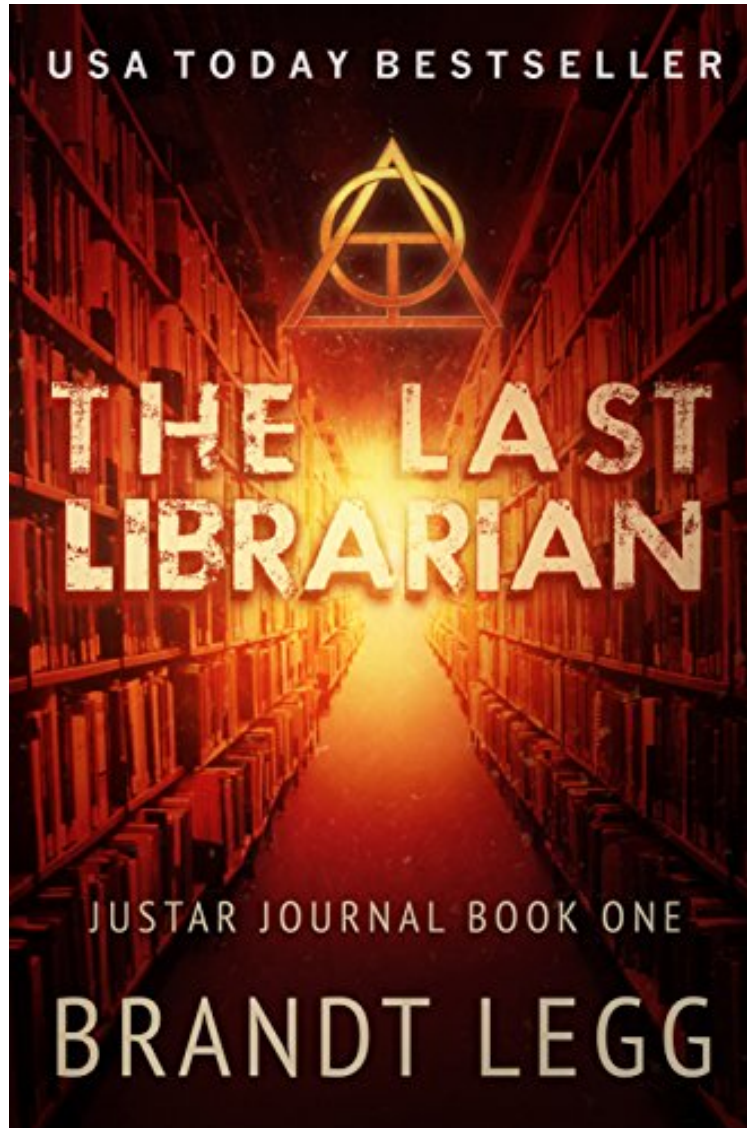

The start was a little slow but that was necessary because when the pace picked up to become fast and exciting, as it did after the first three chapters, I could relate to the characters and the background information without having to resort to a glossary. The reader is drawn into the world of Runit Happerman, the last librarian, and his battle to save the books he loves from physical destruction. Brandt Legg draws our attention to the ease with which electronic books can be manipulated to distort historical fact. It is something we are beginning to see now through mainstream media manipulation, and the presentation via social media of events supposedly factual but which are fiction. Mr Legg provides plenty of thought-provoking scenarios based in reality, taking it a little further down the path of possibility if the current checks and balances did not exist. The world of Runit and his family is one of hidden hands keeping a quiescent population happy in a utopia that is anything but ideal. The means by which the status quo is maintained echoes the kind of events we hear about think of the suspicious deaths of dissenters worldwide and you get an idea of the basis of this book.
